PASTOR'S CHAT

Pastor Nicholas Gleason

Dear Friends,

I pray this note finds you well and blessed. Today we begin a new season. We have just celebrated the Resurrection of our Lord together, and now we are beginning the journey of continuing forth in Him. How do we begin to shape our lives around whom He was?

One of the most detrimental things we ever do to ourselves is comparing ourselves to someone else. It's bad because there is always someone around who is smarter or more successful or more effective at making a difference in the world or more attractive or athletic or more witty or more whatever we wish we were.

Comparing is hard to avoid, because the world we live in is always comparing. Look at any company and compare what the CEO makes with what the janitor who cleans her office makes and you'll see what I mean. And yet, if the janitor didn't do his job, the CEO couldn't very well do hers.

I think the world has probably always been this way. But that's not how the church is supposed to be. The apostle Paul says that the church was never intended to be a community of people where anyone is considered more important or more essential than anyone else. Instead the church is intended to be an outpost, a glimpse of the kingdom of God on earth, a community where the way this world works is turned upside down.

We may have heard Jesus' message enough to know how that is supposed to look. It's where the "last" are what? (*First*) And the "least" are what? (*Greatest*)

Now I would guess that many of you have heard this passage from 1 Corinthians about the church being compared to the human body.

What would you say is the most important body part? Maybe you would pick the brain, heart, or the lungs? How about the eyes or ears? Or even possibly the legs or arms?

What would you say is the least important body part? Eyelashes, nose hairs, fingernails, belly button?

But what if a person didn't have eyelashes? Then the eye wouldn't be protected from dust and dirt. And we would eventually all go blind.

If we didn't have nose hairs to filter out particles in the air and keep them from entering our airways, eventually our airways would become clogged. And we wouldn't be able to breathe properly and we would probably get sick.

Eyelashes and nose hairs may not seem important, but without them, we wouldn't be able to live as well as we do.

Maybe you are someone in the church that is always running things. That's great! Maybe you are an Otterbein Nose Hair. Just as great! We need you. You who are always there, quietly and faithfully doing your part, and helping the body of Christ live and breathe and thrive.

Think about it this way with me. Have you ever done a jigsaw puzzle? I'm not talking about a five piece jigsaw puzzle. I mean one of those five hundred piece jigsaw puzzles?

My grandmother loved those puzzles, and we use to do them together all the time. I remember one time, my grandmother brought over a 2000 piece jigsaw puzzle. It was huge! It took up the entire dining room table, and we spent multiple weekends together putting this gigantic monster together.

And then there was only one single piece left. I was so excited to complete this massive puzzle. My grandmother even gave me the honor of grabbing that last single piece and pushing it into the puzzle. Only...when I looked in the box...the box was empty!

So we ran all over the dining room looking for that piece. But the single remaining puzzle piece was nowhere to be found. The puzzle was left incomplete. It was the most frustrating thing in the world.

My grandmother, seeing how upset I was, colored a piece of paper to look like this missing puzzle piece, and then taped that piece of paper to the puzzle so it looked finished. But it wasn't the same thing.

And this church is not the same thing without your piece added to the puzzle. We need each other to be whole. The brains and hearts, the eyelashes and nose hairs, all of us, to be all that God brought us to be and to do the mission and ministry that the Holy Spirit is empowering us to do.

This is what the season of Lent was all about. Challenging each of us to grow and strengthen ourselves as teammates. We can't complete the task Jesus gave us alone. We need each other. We need the gifts you have been blessed with. We need you to complete what God started in us.

On Sunday, there is a place for you. I pray your piece will not be missing.

One of the recurring stories that we hear at church during the Lenten Season is found in Matthew 21:1-11. It's the story of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on the back of a donkey. We are Christ-bearers that should humbly go about our daily routines reflecting the one we're carrying. This Easter, won't you take a look at your heart and listen to the "donkeywhisperer". He might be leading you to a place you never been, but I'll guarantee you that He will not lead you astray!
