LAY LEADER'S LINE

It is the belief of a vast majority of proletariats as well as numerous influential independents that an ecumenical conclave should be sequestered to determine the effect of existentialism on an autocracy. Do you agree or disagree?

I remember when I was growing up, it used to be fun to find out new words and use them around my classmates. One word in particular was *"antidisestablishmentarianism"*. It was fun to say, but the definition was harder than pronouncing the word! People often use large words to impress the listeners or establish themselves as a *"well-educated-scholar"*, as if they need reassurance that they are somebody.

The Apostle Paul was very familiar with these types of individuals. When Paul was addressing the people of Corinth he said, "And I, brethren, when I came to you, did not come with excellence of speech or of wisdom declaring to you the testimony of God." (1 Corinthians 2:1) The 'INSIGHT' by Dennis Fisher in my devotional says that Corinth had many Greek philosophers who promoted their own form of worldly wisdom. In contrast, Paul relied upon God's wisdom based in the gospel as the foundation of divine truth. Within the death and resurrection of Christ is a secret wisdom that human beings on their own do not understand. Yet for those who believe, the Holy Spirit illuminates God's truth. Worldly wisdom is self governing. Divine wisdom is given by the Holy Spirit.

When the apostle Paul ministered to people, he didn't try to impress others. Paul was a brilliant scholar who could have spoke piously or pompously to express the deep things of God in scripture. Yet he did not use lofty language to elevate his self-importance. As we grow in our understanding of God's Word, let's follow Paul's example and guard against parading knowledge for knowledge's sake. Instead, let's make a New Year's resolution together that we will make an effort to be conscious of our audience and take time to let God give us the words we should use. We should be trying to win others for Christ not for ourselves.

PS. By the way, antidisestablishmentarianism is defined as "the doctrine or political position that opposes the withdrawal of state recognition of an established church." Clear as mud now?


