LAY LEADER'S LINE



"Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. He who does not love does not know God, for God is love." 1 John 4:7-8

In the book 'EVANGALISM WITHOUT ADDITIVES' by Jim Henderson, he teaches the reader how to bring God's love to the people that Jesus misses most. For a long time these people were referred to as the "lost". The author points out, in one of the chapters, that by labeling these people as "lost" sets up an invisible line that can cause the people we are trying to reach as thinking of Christians as pious or better than they are. This is the last thing that we want to do. It is hard enough to share the gospel with those who don't know God without creating a barrier like this to overcome. When I read this chapter of the study, I began to think about how we treat other Christians? Do we treat our differences of beliefs as points to argue about or food for thought? Do we look at other churches as "snobs" or "up-itty" because they large congregations or huge impressive sanctuaries? Let's bring it even closer to home; how about the way we treat the other members of our own church? Read the following scenarios and see if you can recognize any similar reactions in your church.

- A man angrily shuts his hymnbook and pouts through the rest of the service if the song leader doesn't sing every verse of his favorite hymn.
- Members are at odds and argue against adding a new service geared toward youth because they don't like the music.
- The middle aisle of the sanctuary is a demarcation line between two classes of people who refuse to mix.

Sound familiar? I hope not. As Christians, we must stand for truth as spelled out in the Bible. Though truth was not violated in any of these situations, these professing followers of Christ acted in decidedly unloving ways. They chose to protect personal preferences rather than demonstrate the love of Jesus to a watching world. How can we reach those who Jesus longs for if we can't be loving to each other? In 1 John 4:7-21, we see that God's love seeks to transform our behavior. In His love, we don't react disdainfully towards others simply because we don't agree. Jesus said in John 13:35, "By this all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." Do others see the love of Jesus in you? Let's make a goal to increase His love in our lives in this New Year!

 - **K** is for Kneeling (write/pray a prayer, praise, or confession to God while kneeling--if you can)
- 4) On the weekend (*Sat/Sun*), share any scriptures that stood out to you, and/or any questions or observations you may have, by typing them on a group email to those participating.

 Optional: you may share how you have applied (*or intend to apply*) what you read to your life.
- 5) If you have insights to help answer some of the questions shared, or encouraging thoughts to offer, you may continue to share your additional comments throughout the weekend.
- 6) Even if you do not wish to share your comments on the group email, but would simply like to follow along, that is fine too. Just give us your email address below.


