CHUCKIN' ALONG for the LORD

"Be strong and brave; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." Joshua 1:9 (CTV)

IF ANY OF YOU HAVE NOT HEARD THE story of our then-three year old granddaughter's living out of these instructions God gave to Joshua, that oversight will now be remedied.

GOING DOWN A FLIGHT OF STEPS at the building where her mother works for the University of Illinois, Miss Finley decided she needed to do some long jump practice for the 2036 Olympic Games. Her mother decided letting her jump the three steps to the landing was easier than trying to talk her out of it. Before launching herself off of the step down toward her waiting mother, Finley got set, as any good athlete would do, and was ready to go. But then, she hesitated. She engaged in another athletic ritual of preparation when she announced to herself, in a rather loud voice, "I am brave and I am strong," and she leaped into space, putting the wide spot at the bottom of the stairs to the proper use of its name, and "landing" quite successfully and safely.

THIS IS A GOOD, grandparents' story, but it is also a great lesson for us all. We believe what we hear ourselves say. For this reason, we should be saying good

things about ourselves and our congregation here at Otterbein UMC. Yes, we have problems. No, we are not perfect. Finley can't fly, but that didn't keep her from launching out in faith from the third step. In years to come she will probably be jumping from the 4th, 5th and 6th steps, until she finds other ways to prove that she is, "brave and strong." She may get some skinned knees, bruised chin, and maybe even a sprained ankle along the way.

OUR PROBLEMS AT OUMC are merely opportunities (I know you have heard that before, but it is true.) to prove, not only how "strong and brave," we are, but also how good, God whom we serve, is. So if you don't know good things to say about yourself, or about the congregation. Come see me and I will tell you some good things that only a newcomer pastor can see.

EVEN BETTER THAN THAT, go to God in devotions and prayers, OFTEN. God told Joshua to, "be strong and courageous." (NIV) and God doesn't love Joshua and the Hebrew tribes he led, one iota less than God love you, me and Charleston Otterbein UMC.

LAY LEADER'S LINE

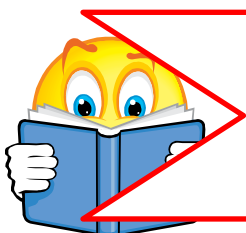

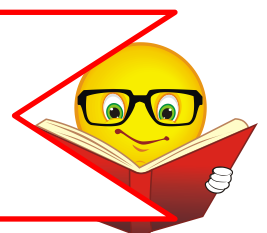
