LAY LEADER'S LINE

In the wake of Robin William's death, I've heard many people around me talking about how could someone who seemed to "have-it-all" take their own life? What could cause that? Why would someone do that? It reminded me of a story I read in a daily devotional about Charles Whittlesey.

Charles was a hero's hero. Leader of the so-called "Lost Battalion" in World War I, he was awarded the Medal of Honor for his bravery when his unit was trapped behind enemy lines. When the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier was dedicated, Charles was chosen to serve as pallbearer for the first soldier laid to rest there. Two weeks later, it is presumed that he ended his own life by stepping off a cruise ship in the middle of the ocean.

Many of us will face depression, anxiety, worries, and troubles that can make us believe that there is no way out. Even one of the greatest prophets, Elijah went out on a day's journey by himself and prayed all night that he may die. (1 Kings 19:4) This was because he was scared of Jezebel who said she was going to kill him. It is hard for us to imagine that on the heels of two great spiritual victories (the defeat of the prophets of Baal and the prayer for rain), Elijah would be so afraid? Often discouragement and fatigue sets in after great spiritual victories, especially those requiring physical effort or involving great emotion. Sometimes the despair and fatigue is just temporary. But often, it's more than despair and more than temporary. That is why we need to talk openly and compassionately about depression. We can start by talking to God. God confronted Elijah with the need to return to his mission which was speaking God's word to Israel. While he was lonely and discouraged, Elijah forgot that there were others who had remained faithful during the nation's wickedness. The problem with self-pity is that the focus is on you and then we can be blinded to all others who are faithfully obeying and fulfilling their duties to God. God offers His presence to us in life's darkest moments, which enables us in turn, to be in His presence to the hurting. Crying out for help-from others and from God- may be the strongest moments of our lives.

FAMILY NIGHT REPORT, 2013-14 SEASON

On May 28, 2014, the Weds Family Night program completed its 4th season with a season finale wiener roast, games, and fellowship in the church yard. This season ran from Sept through May with a few breaks for holidays, weather conditions, etc. We continued the same format as in past years with the meal at 6 pm, then break-out groups from 6:45-7:30 pm for J4J (Kid's Club), LinC (Youth Group), and an Adult Group that alternated between lessons, group discussions, and projects.

Attendance averaged around 35 per week. The season began last Sept with a beginning balance of \$160.65, and ended this May with a \$112.35. Monetary donations were occasionally received through Sunday morning offerings as well as through a donations basket set out on Weds evenings. Non-perishable foods were also donated to the Family Night shelves from time to time.


